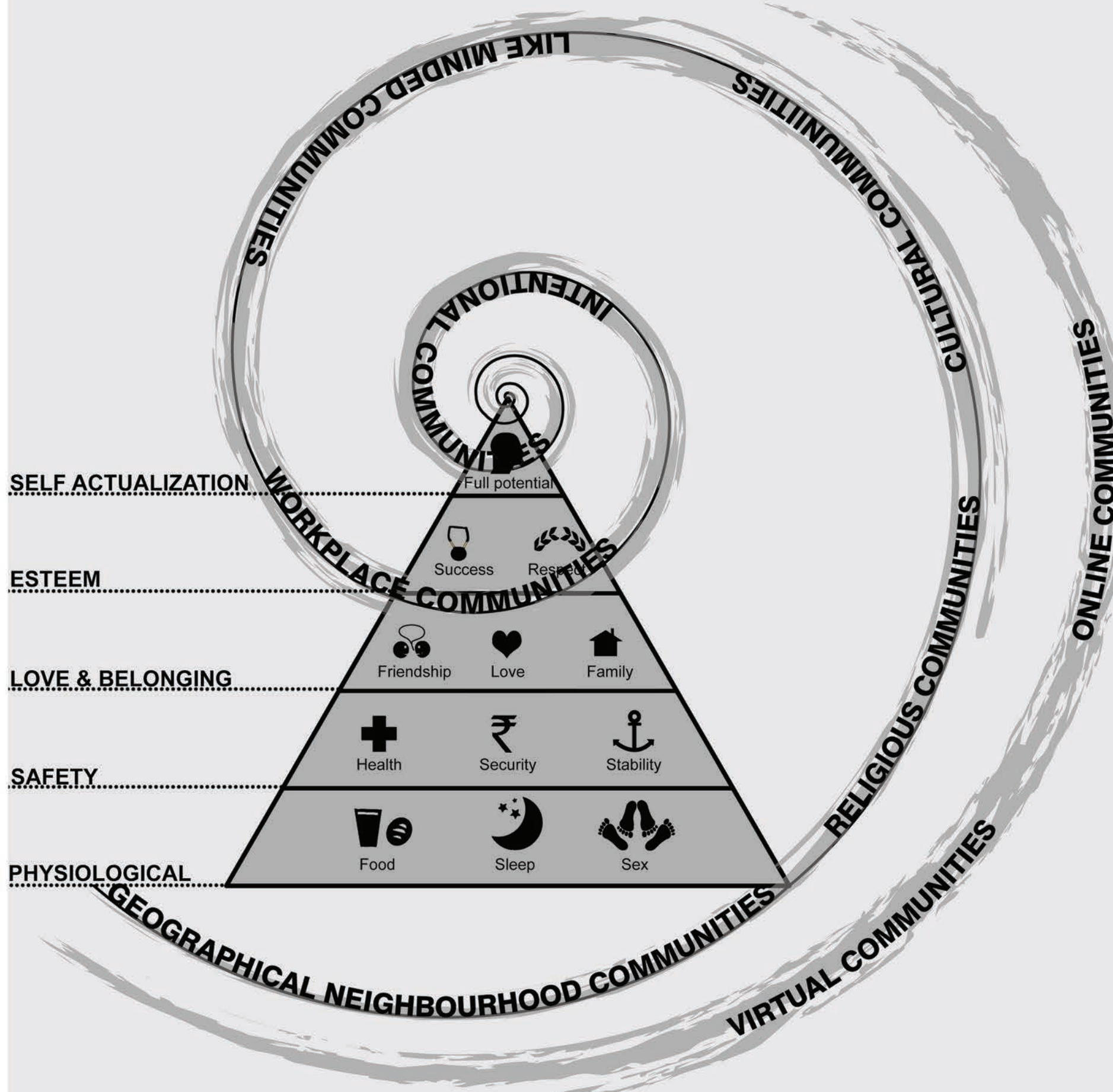


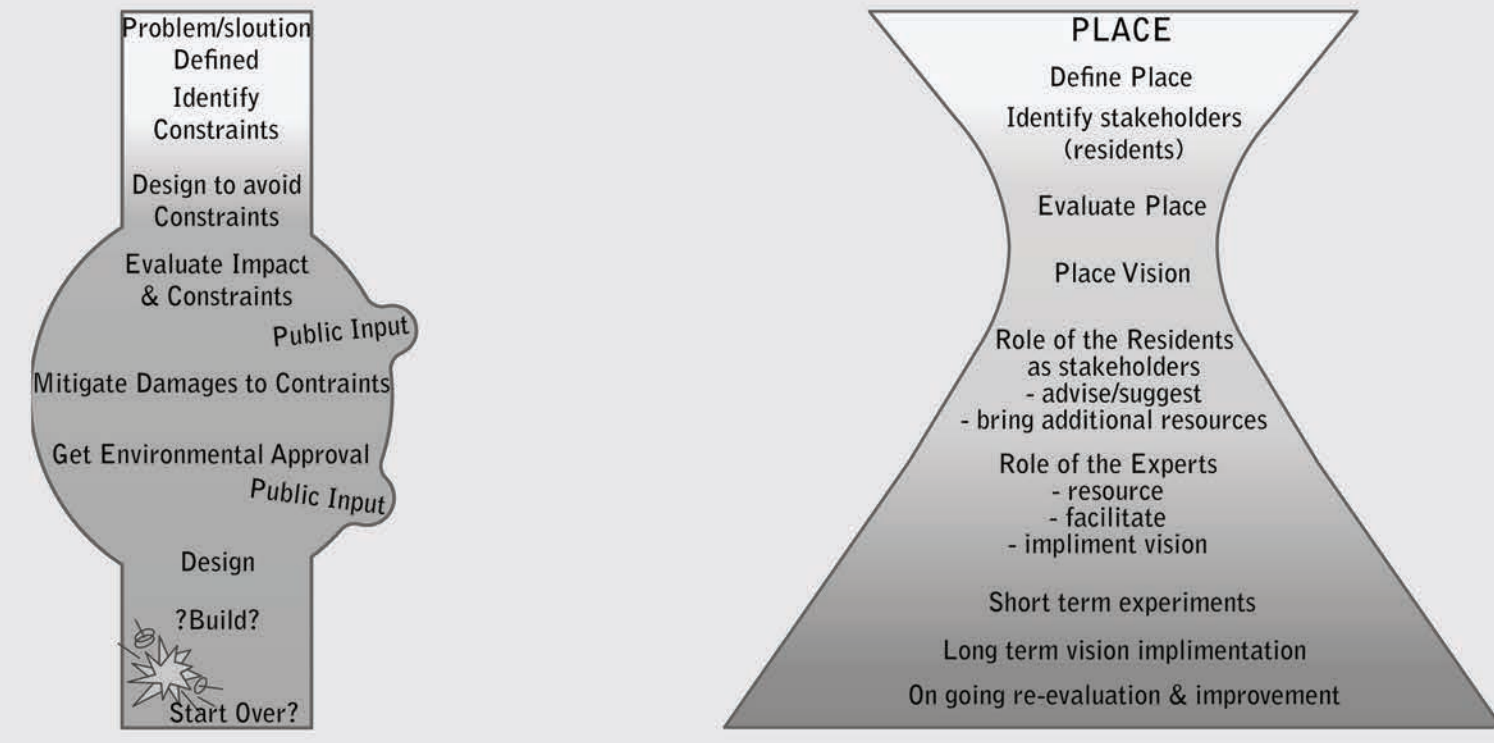
UNDERSTANDING COMMUNITY FOR EMPATHETIC DESIGN

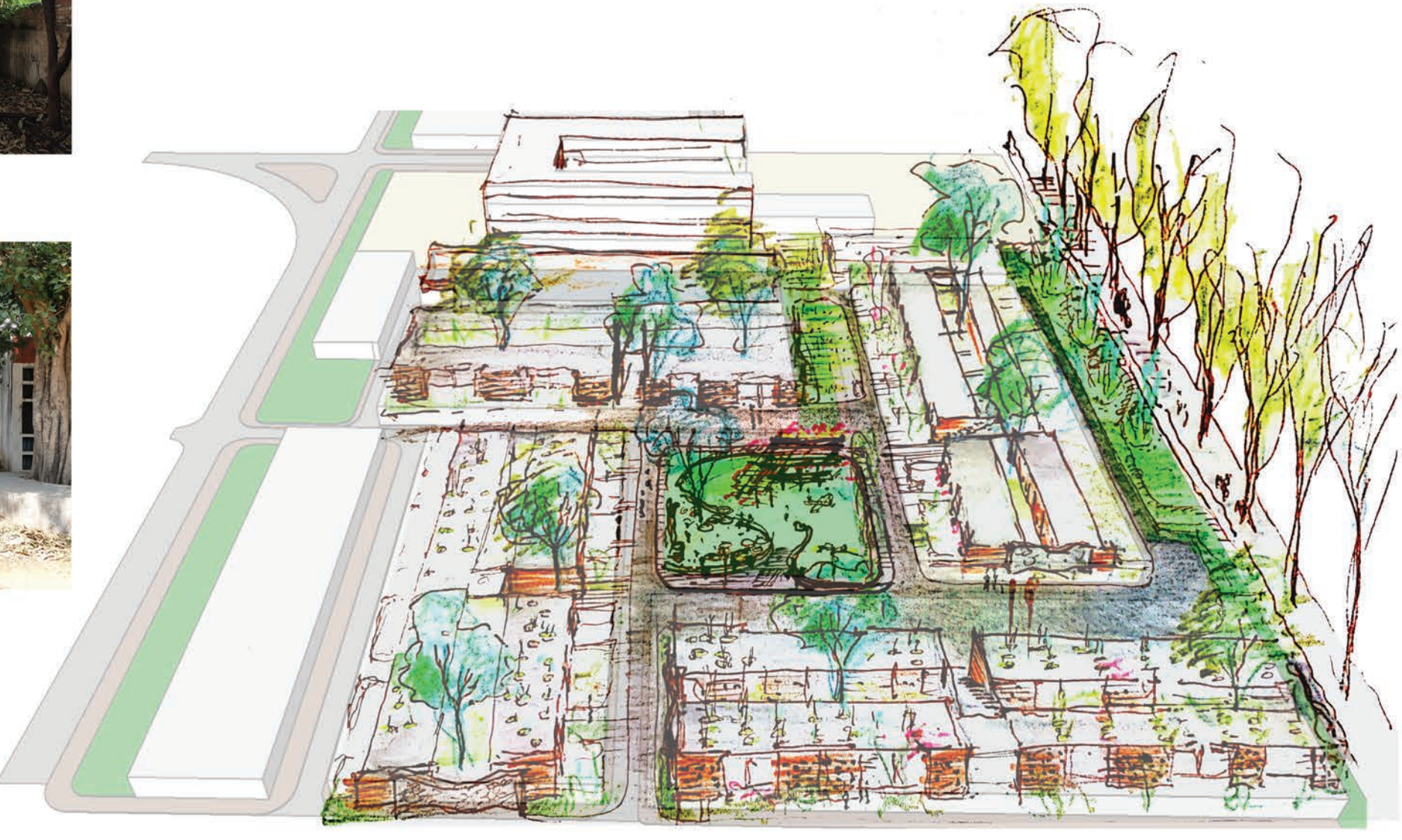
PROPOSAL 1 : ACTIVITY EMBEDDED SPACES TO BRING NEIGHBOURHOOD COMMUNITY TOGETHER

Proposed designed spaces in the neighbourhood

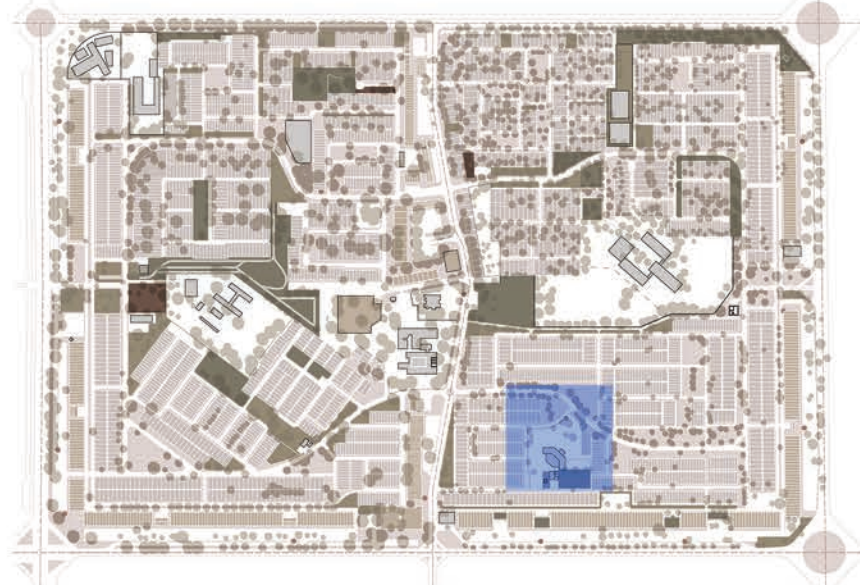
